

## CAFA Supports APPBUSA's request to re-start collective bargaining

September 2, 2025

The Association des professeurs, professeures et bibliothécaires de l'Université Sainte-Anne (APPBUSA) – an invaluable part of Nova Scotia's post-secondary education sector – is facing significant resistance to bargaining by its employer.

The APPBUSA's situation is deeply concerning on many levels:

- 1. Bargaining began in November 2024, with both sides signing an agreement for collegial governance in January 2025.
- 2. However, the employer's USA administration is now refusing to honour the January collegial governance agreement and also attempting to impose a condition on bargaining during conciliation.

In response, the APPBUSA has filed a complaint against the employer for failure to bargain.

Having an administration external to the country attempting to dictate the terms of a collective agreement with a Canadian post-secondary faculty association is highly problematic. In response, and in solidarity with the APPBUSA, CAFA has submitted the letter linked below to the l'Université Sainte-Anne employer.
