The UCP government has decided to provide payments to parents of young children during the ATA strike that would amount to *more than what the ATA is asking for in its collective bargaining*. In essence, they have chosen to ignore the pleas of teachers, parents, and students in favour of a PR move.

When it comes to public education, the government's actions are sending a clear message: They simply do not believe Alberta's children and youth deserve access to high-quality, student-focused, world-class education.

This is a fight for our future we can't afford to lose.

Taxpayer funds that could be invested in more well-equipped classrooms, more well-trained teachers, more manageable workloads, and more well-rounded and globally respected post-secondary institutions are instead diverted toward private, ideologically-driven initiatives, led by UCP-favoured entities.
